School hallways and common areas must be kept clean, clear, and well-maintained at all times. Daily cleaning routines should include checking for and removing obstructions, especially from walkways and exits. All decorations should be securely attached and meet fire code standards. Schools should promote shared responsibility for cleanliness by involving students in tidy-up initiatives and ensuring custodial staff are properly supported to maintain safe, clutter-free environments.
