FACTS

- 4. **Heat Stress:** Groundskeepers often work outdoors in hot and humid conditions, especially during the summer months. Prolonged exposure to high temperatures without adequate hydration or rest breaks can result in heat-related illnesses such as heat exhaustion or heatstroke.
- 5. Musculoskeletal Injuries: Manual tasks such as lifting heavy objects or repetitive motions can strain muscles, joints, and ligaments, leading to musculoskeletal injuries such as sprains, strains, or overuse injuries.
- 6. **Electrical Hazards:** Contact with live wires or faulty electrical equipment can result in electric shocks, burns, or electrocution.

- 7. Wildlife Encounters: Bites, stings, or exposure to disease-carrying pests pose risks to workers' health.
- 8. **Noise Exposure:** Operation of noisy equipment such as lawnmowers, leaf blowers, or chainsaws can lead to hearing loss or other auditory problems if workers are not provided with appropriate hearing protection.

STATS

- According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), in 2019, there were approximately 2.8 million nonfatal workplace injuries and illnesses reported among private industry employers. This includes injuries and illnesses across various sectors, including groundskeeping and maintenance.
- The BLS reported a total of 5,333 fatal occupational injuries in the United States in 2019. While not specific to groundskeeping or maintenance, this statistic highlights the potential severity of workplace hazards in various occupations.
- The BLS reports that in 2019, there were 183 fatal occupational injuries in the landscaping services industry in the United States. While this figure encompasses various aspects of landscaping beyond groundskeeping and maintenance, it indicates the inherent risks associated with this line of work.
