Unfortunately, whoever's responsible for the worker in this picture obviously didn't get the cardinal rule memo. The hat the worker's using to shield his eyes and face from the sun has compromised the fit of the hard hat. And without a snug fit, a hard hat won't provide adequate protection against impact and electrical hazards.

The moral: Instead of wearing the hard hat over his sun hat, the worker should be using sunglasses and/or a hard hat with a detachable brim to shield his face and eyes that's fitted to the hard hat.
