REFLECTIVE CLOTHING: Why You Should Pay Attention

- **EVERY 14 MINUTES:** How often somebody gets hurt in a road construction zone accident
- **EVERY 15 HOURS:** How often somebody gets killed in a road

construction zone accident

- **25:** The percentage of road construction zone fatalities involving large trucks.

5 KINDS OF REFLECTIVE CLOTHING

Reflective, aka high-visibility clothing, reduce your risks of getting hit by a vehicle when you're exposed to traffic hazards. The 5 common types of reflective clothing include:

1. Reflective Vests



2. Reflective Belts



3. Reflective Arm Bands



4. Reflective Jackets



5. Reflective Hats



WHO SHOULD WEAR REFLECTIVE CLOTHING?

Answer: You (*and* Your Dog) if You:

- Work in construction
- Work on highways and roads
- Are a fire fighter, school crossing guard or a parking attendant
- Work in EMS
- Work as a baggage handler or other outdoor operation at an airport
- Jog, bike, or do any other roadside activity **after work**
